

Administrative Procedure: Transportation

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The Superior North Catholic District School Board (the "Board"), as a member of the East of Thunder Bay Transportation Consortium (the "Consortium"), recognizes that the Consortium operationalizes and makes all decisions regarding busing to and from home. The Consortium's governing body has established policies and operational procedures for the Consortium to follow.

All decisions and actions taken regarding transportation outside of home-to-school is the responsibility of the School or Board (eg. charters, field trips).

Attending Another School Other Than Designated School

Where a student, at the request of the parent(s)/guardian(s)/caregiver(s), has been granted permission to attend a school other than the designated school for that area within the Board, the parent/guardian is responsible for transporting the student.

Students placed in another school of the Board, at the Board's discretion, may be eligible for transportation if they can be accommodated on an existing route and if there is room on the bus.

Other Pupils

The Board may arrange transportation to and from school for other pupils (Non-Resident under a Tuition Agreement), providing a cost recovery agreement is in place. The Board may authorize the Transportation Consortium Coordinator to make these arrangements.

Demonstration Schools

The Board may arrange for transportation of its student(s) to and from the Ontario School for the Blind, an Ontario School for the Deaf, a Demonstration School established by or operated under an agreement with the Minister, for pupils with severe communicational exceptionalities or other recognized facility as noted in s.190(3) of the Education Act.

Emergency Changes

In the event of any facility change (eg. school opening/closing) or in an immediate or extended emergency, the Board will contact the Consortium and request necessary changes or modifications in transportation delivery.

Charter/Field Trips



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While the Consortium may provide bus operator contact information to schools, the school is responsible for organizing and funding charter and/or field trips.

Student Conduct

Every pupil is responsible for his/her conduct to the Principal of the school where the pupil attends. The Code of Behaviour developed by the attending school shall govern the conduct of the student. Any breach of any individual school's code of conduct may result in the suspension or cancellation of busing privileges.
