Board Presentation

1. LDAO Website - LD@schools

New Business

1. RSEC (Regional Special Education Committee)

Kerry shared how the RSEC Committee met on November 1st and 2nd in Thunder Bay and focused on sharing board priorities in regards to Special Education Programming and focuses within the board and in schools.

During the two day session, the members worked collaboratively to develop their capacity in developing SIP (Special Incidence Portion) claims for students, as well as various strategies for facilitating professional learning sessions for Special Education teachers and school leaders. As well, several of the Regional Directors shared information and gathered input on the NSI (Northern Supports Initiative)
