- a. <u>Thunder Bay District Health Unit School Climate Survey Presentation</u>, Sophia Wenzel, Thunder Bay District Health Unit
 - i. SNCDBS 2020-2021 School Climate Surveys



- All Boards within Ontario are required to complete School Climate Surveys (SCS) every 2 years for grade 4- 12 students, staff and parents. School Boards and Public Health Units partnered to add a Healthy Living Module to enhance the School Climate Survey. All 9 schools from grade 4 – 8 participated. Results were analyzed and reports prepared by TBDHU Epidemiologists, Program Evaluator and Health Promotion Planner. TBDHU Presented to Principals at meeting on February 24, 2022, and to the Board of Trustees on March 9, 2022
- b. Principal Presentation, Lindsay Costa, St. Martin Catholic School
 - L. Costa presented the learning and initiatives happening throughout St. Martin Catholic School in Terrace Bay. K.Desjardins Superintendent of Education thanked L.Costa for her presentation and noted how evident Faith in Action is and how visible the partnerships in the community are. M.Vasanelli commented how in spite of COVID our schools go above and beyond for student achievement and well-being and implement the Board Strategic Plan in all they do.

c. Director's Report, Maria Vasanelli

- M.Vasanelli highlighted the Lent edition of the SNCDSB Halo.
- M.Vananelli and Senior Team will prepare a report on what has been accomplished in the Strategic Plan to date and share it with Trustees.

d. Student Achievement

- i. <u>Kerry Desjardins, Superintendent of Education Monthly Report</u>
 - The Lexia program was brought in to support individual learning gaps for students.
 - Following March Break, new Kindergarten families will be welcomed face to face for school tours.
 - The monthly attendance draw continues. Each day that a student attends school starting March 21 April 29, 2022, they get one entry into a draw for an Oculus Quest 2. (e.g. 15



days at school = 15 entries)

- ii. Paul Tsekouras, Superintendent of Education Monthly Report
 - The Math and TELT teams have been working together piloting projects to support Math and Lego Robotics. The team is focusing on being intentional with the technology students are using and connecting them to the curriculum.
 - The team has been proactive in planning for EQAO. New this year, EQAO will be an online format for Grade 6 and Grade 3 has an option of paper or Digital. More information is expected following March Break.
 - The Indigenous Education team has developed the educator package for the Gichigiiwedin Asynchronous Winter Games 2022 for the first 2 weeks of March.
 - L.Vanderwey and K.Thomson will continue to support the Indigenous Education portfolio for the remainder of the school year.

e. Finance

 - Funding information was received on February 17th from the Ministry of Education for next year.

- e. OHRC Right to Read Inquiry Report released February 28
 - The OHRC launched its Right to Read public inquiry in October 2019, concerned that Ontario's public education system was failing to meet the needs of students with reading disabilities. One of the inquiry's goals was to find out if these students had meaningful access to education as required by the Ontario Human Rights Code. The comprehensive Right to Read report includes detailed findings and recommendations for the Ministry of Education, school boards and faculties of education on curriculum and instruction, early screening, reading interventions, accommodation, professional assessments and systemic issues.
