Professional Learning Update

1. Special Education Plan 2022 & Parent's Guide to Special Education 2022 -

Consultation and Feedback

Kerry shared the Special Education Plan, as well as the Parent's Guide, for the 2022-2023 school year which was originally distributed in September. The Special Education Plan is aligned with Ministry of Education guidelines. Please take time to read through the Special Education Plan and the Parent's Guide and provide feedback of any changes that may be needed in order to make them easy to read by both Superior North Catholic District School Board Staff and parents. New Business

1. Mental Health Update - Tracy Bryson

Tracy was unable to attend today's meeting. She asked Kerry to share some updates.

On February 16,2023, 11 Superior North Catholic District School Board staff members received Behaviour Management Systems (BMS) training, specifically

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the Autism Awareness Module. Feedback indicated that it was an incredible learning experience, especially for newer staff. There will be another training session on March 29,2023 from 9am-1:30 pm.

The Mental Health and Wellbeing Team collaborated with the Student Mental Health and Wellbeing Team for Pink Shirt Day in order to promote kindness. Not only did all schools participate in Pink Shirt Day, activities were also planned throughout the week.

The partnership that Superior North Catholic District School Board has with Children's Centre Thunder Bay continues to grow. Two counsellors with their Masters of Social Work are now working with our students. To date, 28 students have been referred, and only 7 remain on the waitlist.

2. <u>SMART Hub Information</u> - Kerry Dejsardins

Kerry met with Jamie Foster, a SmartStart Hub worker at George Jeffrey Children's Centre. The flyer linked above was shared to be distributed with all families, as well as at the Welcome to Kindergarten Information Nights. SmartStart Hub helps families coordinate services and gives them the opportunity to connect them with child development agencies. SmartStart Hub can be accessed by families with children up to 19 years old.

- 3. Fee for Service Providers 2023-2024 Kerry Desjardins
 Weekly services have been difficult due to location and available services.
 Superior North Catholic District School Board has entered into Fee For Service models with several agencies: Tiny Eye, Superior Speech Services, Ignite Consulting, George Jeffrey Children's Centre, Dr. Sarah Sinclair (Sinclair Psychological Services).
- 4. March Break & Summer Learning Opportunities Kerry Desjardins
 A letter to parents went home explaining the opportunity to enroll in Coding
 Camps for students grades 1-8. The Superior North Catholic District School Board
 wanted to offer students who have nothing planned for the March Break
 something to do. Three students will be participating in the grade 1-4 Coding
 Camp.

We have received confirmation that Summer Learning funding will continue this year, additional options will be available for students to engage in summer learning opportunities. Staffing is currently being put in place.

Regional Special Education Committee Update - Kerry Desjardins
 The Regional Committee, which includes the Leads from 8 School Boards, met in

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February and discussed consistency from Board to Board. A Jordan's Principle navigator spoke about opportunities and how to navigate the process, as well as access funding. A lawyer also discussed exclusions and suspensions for students' with special needs and disabilities. This helped the Boards to understand through a human rights lens.

Dilico Anishinabek Family Care - Jennifer Moore

Dilico is coming to the end of the fiscal year, referrals remain high. Staff is back in the office and no longer using the hybrid model.

Dilico has received funding for Youth Empowerment Camps. There will be 4 virtual sessions held in March which will include beading and drum teaching, among other things. Children are reporting, however, that thye are burnt out and getting tired of virtual sessions, so enrolment numbers are low. Wrist lanyards have been ordered to promote 'Hope' and have a crisis hotline phone number printed on them.

The Dilico brochure has been updated.

George Jeffrey Children's Centre - Andrea Stach

Interest has increased in the Entry to School Program. The program will be going into its third cohort. The first 6 months are in the Entry to School classroom and runs in the afternoons. There will be at least twelve students in the next two cohorts, which will run March to August. The positive impact on the eight students who have completed the first round of the program is evident.

The Infant Child Development Program is a brand new program being offered. Funding comes from the Ministry. A new Infant Child Development Worker, Chantal Barrett, has been hired to run the program. She is based out of the NOSP

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office in Geraldton. The program supports children aged 0-school age.
