Business Arising Out of Minutes

Professional Learning Update

Mental Health and Well-being Presentation 22-23 - Tracy Bryson
 Tracy introduced herself and acknowledged Catholic Education Week and Children's Mental Health Week.

Professional Development Opportunities - we have been able to offer some exciting opportunities this year:

- letters were sent out to grades 7 and 8 parents offering 'Living Works' courses for parents and caregivers
- Anti-Human sex trafficking presentations with Beendigen were conducted for both parents and students in grade 7 and 8, as well as some in grade 6
- Mental Health First Aid First Nations was offered boardwide
- Behaviour Management Systems training was offered to all Educational Assistants, with an Autism Awareness module offered to teachers as well
- SNCDSB partnered with Superior Greenstone District School Board to offer a substance use awareness presentation through Drug Free Kids Canada

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 Restorative Practices such as using 'I messages' and 'I statements' have been encouraged

Mental Health & Wellbeing Promotion:

- a boardwide Student Mental Health & Wellbeing Leadership Committee has been formed for all grade 5-8 students, students will board and chair the meetings moving forward
- a Mental Health & Well-being monthly newsletter is being sent to principals for insertion into their Monday Memo's
- schools participated in initiatives for Anti-Bullying Week, Pink Shirt Day, Bell Let's Talk Day, etc.
- Mental Health Week is this week with many events planned, it highlights the need for mental health now, this year's theme is 'My Story,' promoting what does mental health mean to you?
- Noojimo Health Clinic is running three programs for grade 7 and 8 classes at three schools, including three counsellor in the classroom programming and multiple student sessions.

Partnerships:

- two part time social workers are employed by Children's Centre Thunder Bay, 34 students have been referred since September 2022
- Partnerships continue with Dilico, NOSP, MHAN, Fee for Service Providers, etc.
- Stress Busters run through Strong Minds Strong Kids

What's next:

- community partnerships will continue
- Greenspace partnership will commence next school year
- Action Planning for 2023-2024 in underway, Tracy Bryson and Kerry Desjardins will meet with Principals and schools to ensure their voices are heard.

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We are in the process of making any revisions to the plan and will bring the Motions to the SEAC Committee at the June meeting. 2. Summer Learning Program, including Summer Learning for Students with Special Needs - Kerry Desjardins

We are fully staffed for Summer Learning and are moving forward with registration.

We will be continuing our partnership with Tiny Eye throughout the summer and already have thirteen families committed to summer Tiny Eye learning.

3. <u>2023-2024 Education Funding : A Guide to Special Education Funding</u> - Kerry Desjardins

Kerry wanted to ensure SEAC members had access to this guide and highlighted that: no funding has been lost in regards to the Special Education Grant for Student Needs. The Board has committed to using all available funds to ensure full time Learning for All in all schools, and that the Board has funded 29 Educational Assistants this year.

Special Education Grant - we will still be receiving funds per pupil, Special Education funding, etc.

Northern Adjustment Funds- continuing to receive funding to support Northern Ontario students.

The rest remains status quo. Please contact Kerry Desjardins with any questions.
