COVID Protocols

We encourage all students to self-screen every day before attending school. The self-screening tool can be found online: https://covid-19.ontario.ca/school-screening/

All students who are experiencing symptoms consistent with COVID-19, as identified in the self-screening tool, must not attend school and should follow the guidance provided in the screening tool, which may include seeking appropriate medical attention as required, and/or getting tested for COVID-19. If you have any questions, please contact the school or health unit.

St Edward Catholic School remains a mask-friendly space. Masks will be available to students and staff who wish to wear one. The use of masks is optional.

Breakfast Program:

We will be offering the breakfast program in the gym, starting at 8:40. We are also looking for volunteers to assist with the breakfast program. If you would like to be a volunteer please contact the school.

Daily Routine

- There is no supervision of students until 8:40. At 8:40 students may choose to come inside for breakfast program in the gym or go outdoors to play in the back of the school yard.
- JK to 3 students will enter at the primary doors and Grades 4 to 8 will enter at the main entrance students can proceed to the breakfast program or out to the back of the school yard.
- Students encouraged to wash their hands at the beginning of the day and throughout the day.
- Students will be dismissed at 3:05 and line up at their designated entrance attendance will be taken for bus
 students first and they will board the bus, once the bus has safely departed Kiss and Ride will begin, walkers may
 leave the school at 3:05 unless they are waiting for a parent/guardian/babysitter then they will remain at their
 designated exit and be dismissed after the bus students.

Nutrition Break: 10:35 - 11:05 - The Kindergarten to Grade 4 students will eat first (15 minutes) then go outside (15 minutes). The Grade 5 to 8 students will go outside first (15 minutes) then come indoors to eat (15 minutes).

Lunch: 12:45 - 1:25 - The grades JK to 3 will eat first (20 minutes) then go outside. Students in Grades 4 to 8 will go outside first (20 minutes) and then come indoors to eat (20 minutes).

There will also be a cart set out by the main doors so that parents/guardians can drop off lunches for students if needed. We ask you to label the lunch (markers will be available) and place it in your child's/children's labelled class basket. We will then deliver these to the classrooms.

Students are welcome to remain at school for lunch, however students are encouraged to go home for a change in setting. Students remaining at school for lunch are to respect and follow the lunchroom rules. Students who regularly stay for lunch are not permitted to leave the school grounds without written permission or a phone call/text from a parent/guardian. We do allow for you to write a general letter of permission and have your child bring it to the office so that we can keep it on file. Students who eat lunch at school will be eating under the supervision of our lunchroom supervisors. All students eat lunch in the classrooms.



Kiss and Ride

St. Edward Catholic School's Kiss and Ride area is designated as a safe place for adults in vehicles to pick up and/or drop off students. The following procedures and routines are in place to ensure the safety of everyone:

- *pull forward to the Kiss and Ride "stop" pylon (first pylon you see on the map as you enter)
- *A staff member will approach your vehicle please remain in your vehicle
- *if your child is not in line, please drive around until s/he is present
- *put your car in park while the supervisors are assisting to load/unload your child(ren)
- *students load/unload from the passenger side of the car only
- *keep goodbyes brief
- *if your child needs assistance with the seatbelt, pull forward to the end of the **loop** and stop to provide help as staff, are unable to do up seatbelts
- *do not pass other cars that are picking up and/or dropping off children
- *do not park in the Kiss and Ride area and leave your vehicle unattended
- *exit the Kiss and Ride area promptly after loading/unloading

Thank you for your cooperation and patience as we implement this procedure to keep our school community safe!

*vehicles will not be allowed access to the Kiss and Ride area until the busses have safely departed!

SEPTEMBER's Virtue - RESPECT

The art of treating yourself, other, and the world with kindness, fairness and equality. School Safety

As per the Ontario Fire Code, we are required to conduct a total evacuation fire drill 3 times in each of the fall and spring terms while school is in session. These practice drills are necessary to ensure the safety of our students and staff in case of a real fire emergency.

Lockdown is used in a serious emergency situation where the threat is inside a school, on or very near to school property. A Lockdown minimizes access and visibility in an effort to shelter students, staff and visitors in secure locations.
